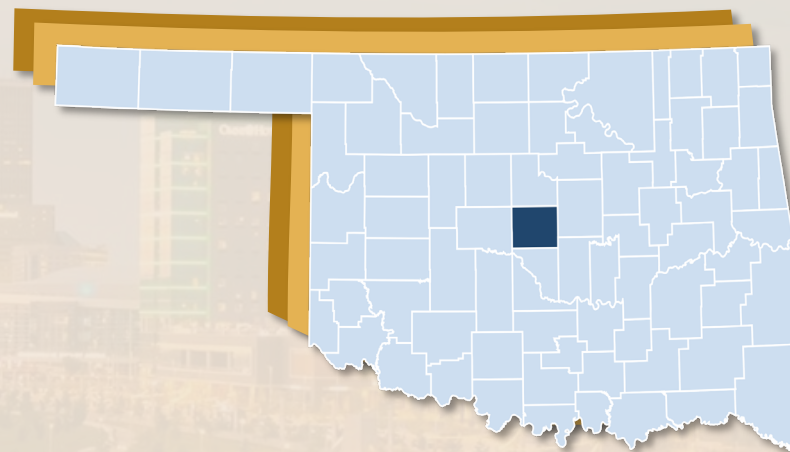

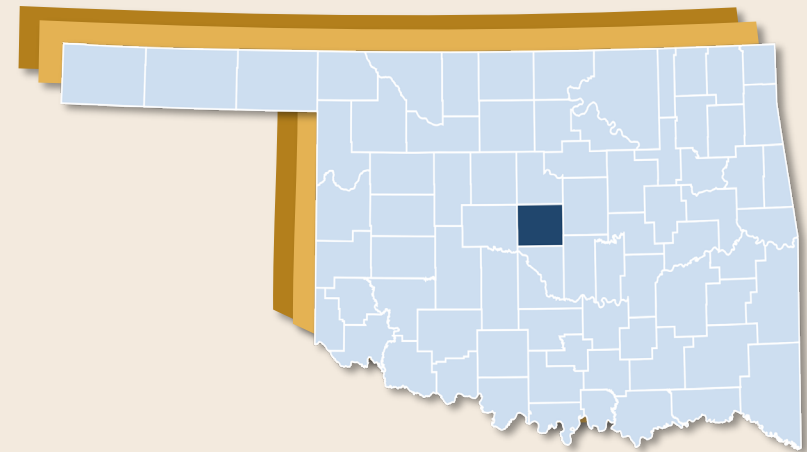

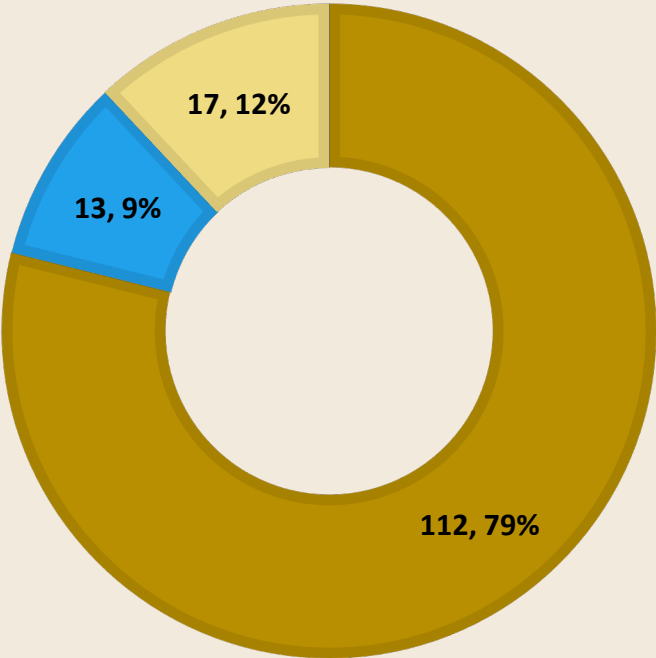

Projects by Completion

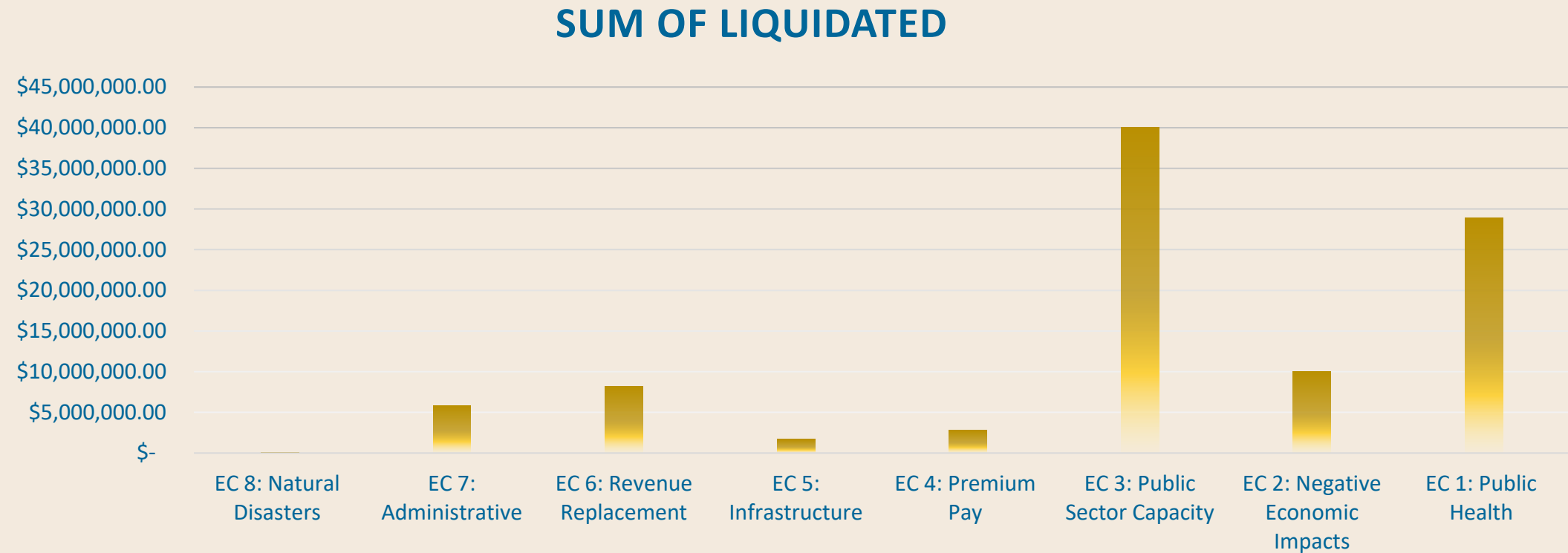
ALL PROJECTS: BASED ON COUNTY LIQUIDATION

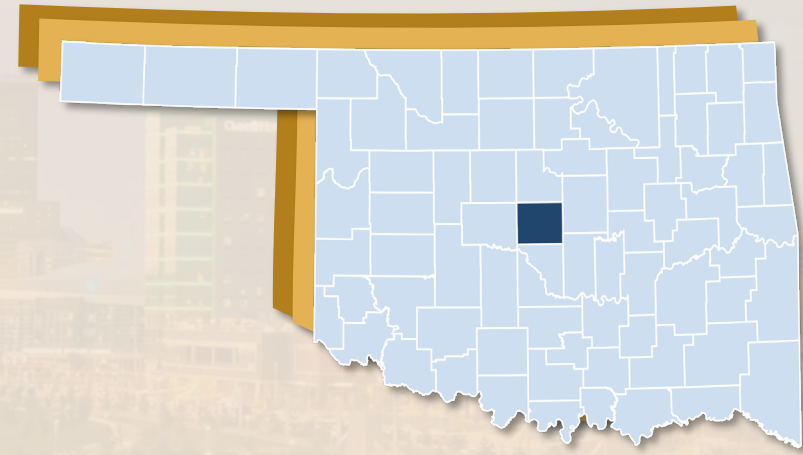


Fund Status Per Expenditure Category (EC)

Subrecipient Management

Deer Creek Natural Disaster Generator Services

Oklahoma County sought to provide Local Government Fire Departments with **back-up generators**. In case of an emergency, this generator helps **blow water and serves as a plunger** for the fire department if they run out of power. The allocation of ARPA funds to the Deer Creek Fire District for acquiring generators was a critical measure to **bolster emergency response capabilities** in an area increasingly affected by severe weather events. The generators will ensure that the Deer Creek Fire District **maintains operational effectiveness during power outages**, thereby enhancing their ability to respond promptly and effectively to emergencies.

Make-A-Wish Oklahoma Post Pandemic Wish Pipeline Reduction Project

Make-A-Wish Oklahoma works to ensure critically ill children in the community have **something beyond scary surgeries and difficult treatments** on which to focus. Funding is used to **cover operational costs** to **recover from the pandemic** and **continue providing this vital support**. By offering a wish experience-doctors, families, and wish kids report that distraction from the illness **produces positive emotions** and the **will to continue fighting** for their mental and physical health.

LiveFree OKC Violence Intervention Project

The LiveFree OKC program is designed to assist community **members who are vulnerable and marginalized**. The clients typically face challenges such as **unemployment, absence of professional, career skill** and or education certifications or degrees, and may have **criminal legal records or open cases**. The program will utilize ARPA funds to directly support these clients by **providing a variety of supportive resources** as needed. These resources include and are not limited to educational services, employment services, housing resources, legal services, and health services.



Desk review scheduled for **August**

Land Development Costs (Turning Point Ministries)

In 2023, Turning Point was gifted 5.1 acres of land in Edmond to **develop a new neighborhood**. They requested funds for use towards the **engineering, development and groundwork for the new neighborhood**. They will be able to put approximately **22 new**, attainably priced homes on the land to help meet housing shortage demands.

Cornerstone Creek Section 1 Down Payment Assistance

Cornerstone Creek Section 1 aims to provide well-built, energy-efficient, and affordable **single-family homes** for limited- to moderate-income individuals and families. Section 1 includes **91 homes with plans to build a total of 450 homes** over the next 10 years. Cornerstone Creek will also **provide economic diversification** within the area. Future homeowners can purchase these homes without a down payment. The requested funds will assist them in making a significant step towards **homeownership accessibility in Oklahoma County**.

Whiz Kids

Whiz Kids does not only focus on literacy but also breaking the cycle of poverty. They believe that homelessness often stems from a lack of both material and relational support. They provide students and families with **deep relational support they need to thrive**. Their sites walk alongside families in our community and **help them navigate difficult circumstances**. By intervening before third grade, Whiz Kids lay the groundwork for a lifetime of success, **empowering children with skills and confidence** they need to excel academically and emotionally.

Teaching and Saving Kids Project 58:12

The project requested funding to renovate and furnish **a vacant nursing home** located in NE Oklahoma City. This facility will be used to **house, feed, mentor, educate and prepare juveniles** for school, GEDs, gainful employment, transportation, and a productive law-abiding lifestyle without the threats of violence, criminal activity, gang involvement, and intoxicating substances. The project will **reduce/counteract certain community issues**, such as juvenile violence, incarceration, criminal activity, homelessness, hunger, gang involvement, school dropout, recidivism, homicides, and the growing rate of juvenile delinquency.



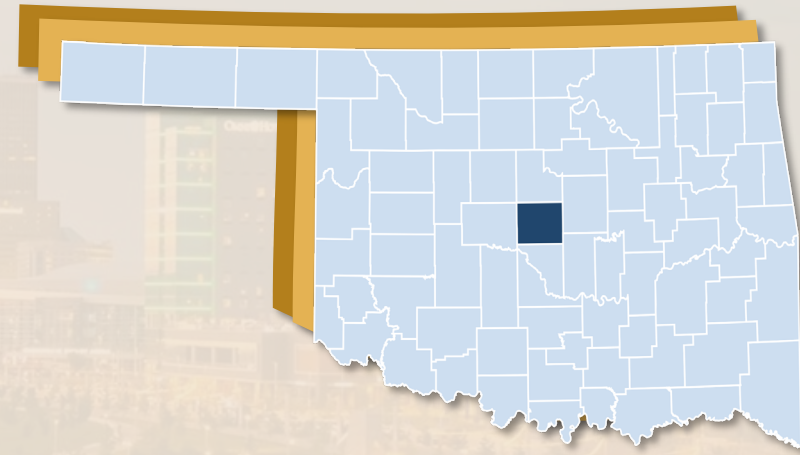

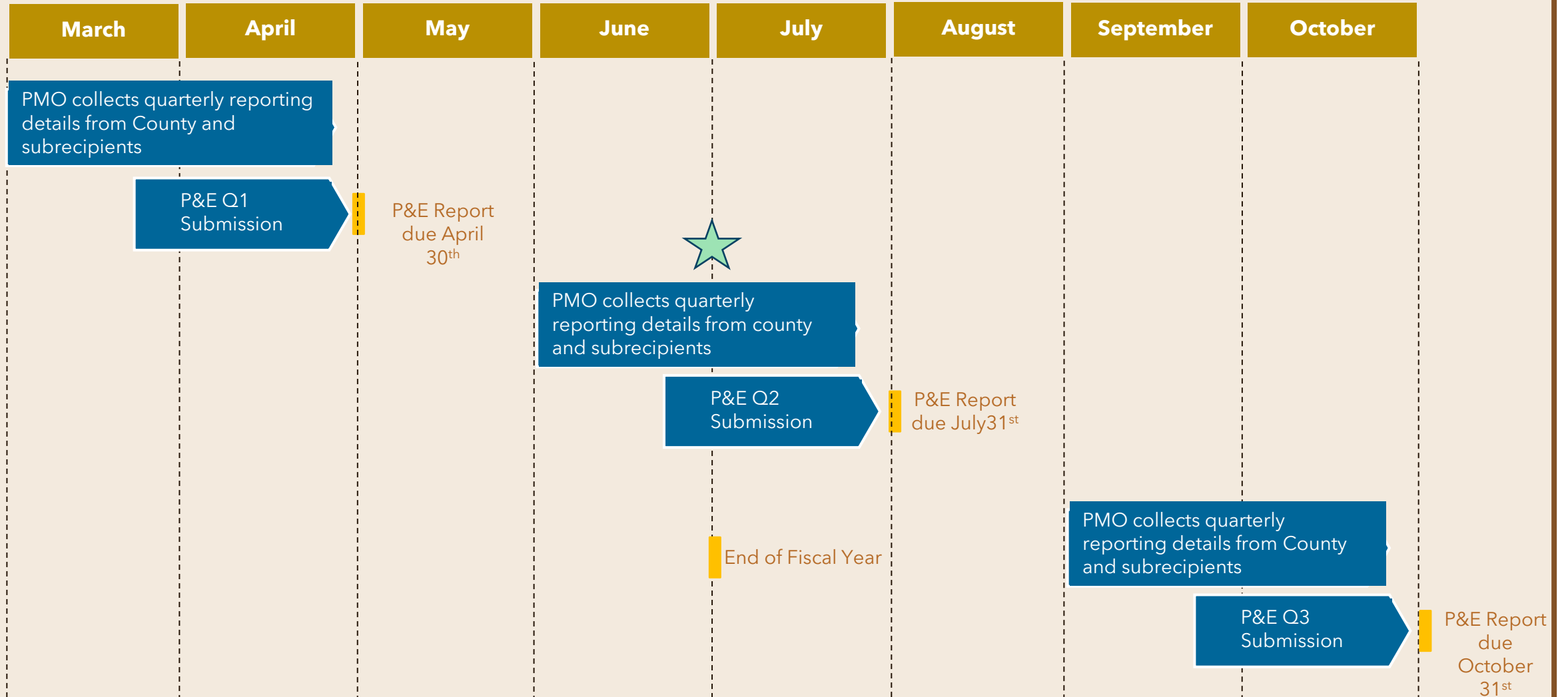

- Description of how funds are being used within eligible categories and how this aligns with the overarching fund strategy

Promoting Equitable Outcomes

- Explanation of how funded projects are impacting target populations

Community Engagement

- Summary of outreach strategies with the public throughout planning and implementation

Labor Practices

- For infrastructure projects, workforce practices must be described

Use of Evidence

- Details on how evidence-based interventions are being measured

Performance Report

- Quantitative data on outputs and outcomes for each project

Project Inventory

- Project name and Identification number
- Funding amount
- Status
- Description

Metric Confirmation

Project scope confirmations were sent to confirm key metrics like KPIs and general quarterly reporting figures for 50+ grantees with active projects



Amendments

Based on responses from project confirmations, amendments will be made to better reflect progress and needs, in terms of both scope and budget



Grantee Reporting

Grantees are expected to submit quarterly reports for the cycle of April through June, in early July



Site Visits

Additional site visits and desk reviews will be conducted starting in the month of August based on grantee reports and project progress

Annual Report Updates

New Projects

- **70+ new projects** that were not included in the previous annual report are now updated and reflected

Mandatory Reporting

- **60 projects with mandatory reporting** (under SLFRF guidelines) for **18 Expenditure Categories**, as compared to the 7 from the previous year
- ARPA funding has been expanded to **cover community projects** in addition to food security, mental health, education, childcare, tourism, etc.

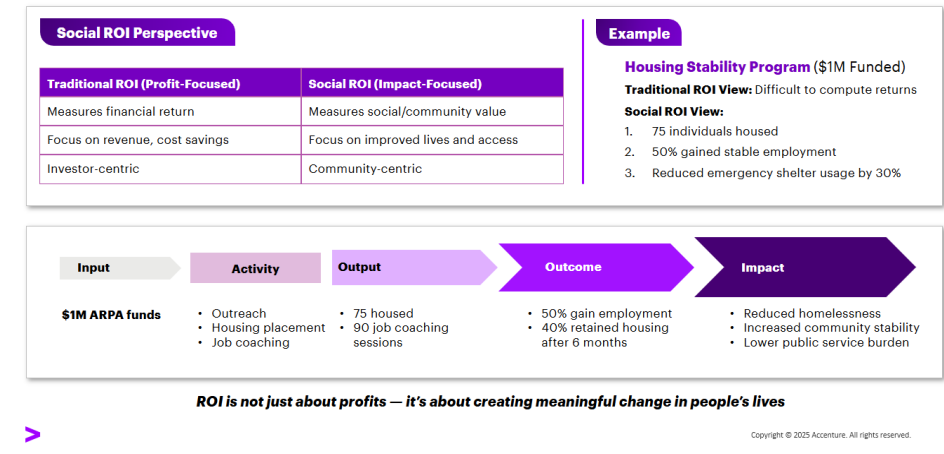
Design-Thinking Workshops

- A new section on the **design-thinking workshops** has been added, which effectively helped some grantees visualize their project's impact

Design-Thinking Workshop

This year, we held **two impactful design thinking workshops** aimed at assisting our subrecipients in maximizing the social return on investment (ROI) of their funded projects. The workshops focused on several key activities to help participants understand and demonstrate the impact of their projects, including **Outcome Snapshot**, **Output Tracking**, **Impact Deep Dive**, and **Qualitative Narratives**. Additionally, the workshops also covered the concept of **Reframing ROI**, shifting the focus from traditional profit-centric to impact-focused ROI. Participants learned that ROI is not just about profits, but about creating meaningful change in people's lives.

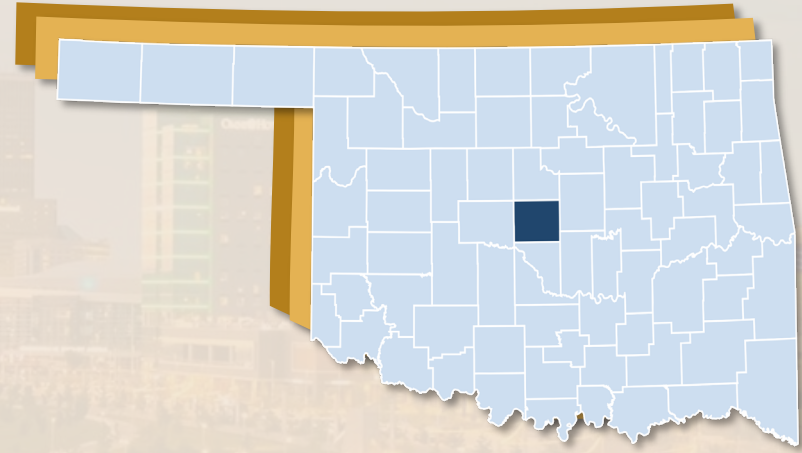
