Beginning in 2007, the Oklahoma County Office of Emergency Management has enjoyed shared use of the Regional Multi-Agency Coordination Center (RMACC), 4600 N. Martin Luther King Boulevard, with the Oklahoma City Office of Emergency Management. This arrangement has proven extremely valuable for both entities during planning and training activities, and in a variety of disasters and events.

Pursuant to the current Annual Lease Agreement between the City of Oklahoma City and Oklahoma County, on behalf of the Oklahoma County Office of Emergency Management, this document is to provide formal 30-day notification of Oklahoma County Emergency Management discontinuing day-to-day occupancy of the previously identified facility, beginning March 1, 2026.

Oklahoma County is now occupying a new Emergency Operations Center facility at 2109 N.E. 36th.
