PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE OKLAHOMA CITY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SERVICES FOR OKLAHOMA COUNTY

FY 2025-2026

- 1. The Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) of Oklahoma County engages the Oklahoma City Economic Development Foundation (Foundation) to provide professional services for the approved economic development programs in Oklahoma County as outlined in **Attachment A**.
- 2. The professional services include all professional staff work and other related resources necessary, as well as all managerial, administrative, and fiscal services needed to accomplish the defined scope of work. Such services include the submission of all required reports. In the performance of such services, the Foundation agrees to respond to all reasonable requests for services made by the BOCC. A detailed listing of services to be performed and performance measures to be employed, is provided as **Attachment A**.
- 3. In performing these services, the Foundation shall provide and be compensated for providing the necessary, qualified, and competent personnel assigned to the accomplishment of the objectives set for in scope of work. BOCC shall pay the Foundation for services rendered for FY (Fiscal Year) 2025/2026 in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand dollars (\$250,000) to conduct approved programs and activities. Semi-annually, the Foundation shall submit an invoice along with a report with sufficient detail to document the Foundations work to accomplish the objective set forth in **Attachment A**.

The report shall include a narrative overview outlining:

- Major accomplishments
- Ongoing work and project management
- Quantitative progress toward stated goals
- Additional attachments or information needed to support the program of work
- 4. The Foundation agrees to collect and maintain records and to provide access to BOCC upon its request to information related to the documentation of the accomplishment of and reporting on the program of work under this Agreement. BOCC agrees, to the extent permitted by law, to work with the Foundation to maintain the confidentiality of information related to prospects and projects. However, it shall be the obligation of the Foundation to intervene, on its own behalf to protect its confidential, trade secret and copyrighted documents at any hearing or to initiate any action to determine same.
- 5. To the extent possible under law, BOCC shall assist the Foundation in protecting confidential, trade secret and copyrighted documents, whether disclosed or not under the terms hereof, by notifying the Foundation of any such request and providing the Foundation

- the reasonable opportunity to file an appropriate action precluding the release of such documents by BOCC.
- 6. This Agreement shall be effective for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025 and shall continue through June 30, 2026, upon BOCC approval. Either party may cancel this Agreement upon sixty days written notice. If this Agreement is cancelled, BOCC will pay any prorated funds due to the Foundation.
- 7. The Foundation is acting as an independent contractor and the employees, agents and consultants of the Foundation are not employees of Oklahoma County.

Background
