
85 % Decrease in overdoses in February compared to January


- 30% complete with HVAC Upgrade

- HVAC project (new duct detectors & new dampeners and new heating sensors in pods and total cleaning of ductwork, all smokes replaced. \$4.7M project
- 2nd floor on track to be completed by Friday
- Construction on 10 doors in the classifications intake pod to provide medical observation until inmates can be screened through proper procedures.
- Completed upgrade in camera operations

- 193 days of data
- 10,626 intakes during data period
 - 5390 (50%) screened positive for at least one category
 - Data depicted will have overlap
 - Data is self-reporting at intake




February 2025 OKLAHOMA COUNTYTOP 5 ARRESTING AGENCIES

Murder/Manslaughter-Current










Average Daily Population-February
