Project Goals:

To work 2676 hours of overtime high visibility enforcement in Oklahoma County in FY21, contributing to statewide traffic safety improvement goals.

Project Goals: To provide 185 community education and awareness opportunities in Oklahoma in FY21, contributing to statewide traffic safety improvement goals.

Problem Identification:

U.S. Census quick facts (2019 numbers are not available) July 1, 2018 estimate shows 3,956,079 persons in Oklahoma, of which 792,582 reside in Oklahoma County representing approximately 20% of the State's population. Oklahoma County, including Oklahoma City, has a vast array of venues that serve alcoholic beverages, which contributes to the number of alcohol-related accidents. The most recent data available reflects there were 3,109 alcohol-related crashes in Oklahoma in 2018 of which 688 occurred in Oklahoma County, the most of any county in the State.

There were 655 fatal crashes reported in Oklahoma in 2018, there were 82 in Oklahoma County more than the second most county of Tulsa which had 63.

FY 2018 facts show 10,128 KAB crashes in the state of Oklahoma and there were 2,178 KAB crashes in Oklahoma County. Of those crashes there were 142 alcohol, 44 drug, 222 speed, 266 distracted, 144 teen and 234 older driver, and 1,271 other KAB crashes which include failure to obey traffic control sign or device as well as other offenses.

The 2018 seatbelt survey indicated a decrease in the number of restrained occupants in Oklahoma County, was 86.5% in 2016 and 83.9 in 2018 which just below the State average of 85.6% in 2018. This shows we need to increase occupant protection enforcement in an effort to increase seatbelt usage in Oklahoma County.

This year's application will focus on aggressive general traffic enforcement in Oklahoma County in an effort to decrease the number of KAB crashes in Oklahoma County

Grant Agreement Summary - Part 1

Project Description:

The Oklahoma County Sheriff's Office (OCSO) will conduct high visibility enforcement utilizing overlime hours in support of State and National goals to reduce the incidence of KA crashes in their community. To identify those times and locations where KA crashes most often occur, the Project Director should utilize all data and reference sources available including but not limited to, DDACTS, crash reports, arrest records, survey results, and other sources. General traffic enforcement is intended to allow agencies to address a greater variety of traffic violations, dependent upon local problem identification. The project director will work with the program manager and asses all data to address areas of concern including but not limited to Occupant Protection, impaired Driving and Speeding. High visibility Occupant Protection enforcement, impaired driving enforcement, speed enforcement and saturation patrols will be utilized to address these focus areas. The program manager will provide feedback and request directed enforcement throughout the grant year based on prior reporting and coordinated activities.

Overtime hours will be paid at the rate determined by the Oklahoma County Sheriff's Office subject to the policies therein, not to exceed 1.5 times hourly rate unless contractually required. Part-time hours worked by part-time or reserve deputies will be paid at the regular rate of the deputy according to department policy.

Traffic Safety Educators: Two (2) full-time deputies will be funded as Traffic Safety Educators charged with conducting traffic safety programs statewide, utilizing the Rollover Simulator, Mule/Gator vehicle and Distracted/Impaired Driver Simulator to provide outreach statewide. These deputies will partner with schools, non-profits, and other agencies in order to expand opportunities to elevate traffic safety programs throughout the state of Oklahoma.

Funding is provided for out-of-state travel for two (2) project personnel to attend the Lifesaver's Conference to learn new and improved traffic safety strategies and submit a report to the OHSO to assist in statewide planning efforts.

Funding is provided forone (1) Kawasaki Mule with graphics @ \$12,379.00, and one (1) flat bed trailer to haul Mule @ \$2,800 in compliance with Buy America Act and other applicable exemptions, NHTSA pre-approval required.

The Oklahorna County Sheriff's Office will employ the following evidence-based strategies in conducting grant related activities:

1). Countermeasure: High Visibility Enforcement Planned Activity: State and Local High Visibility Enforcement

2), Countermeasure: Public Information and Education Planned Activity: Driver Education Programs



Obligated - The proposed level of resources and/or accomplishments

Program Manager - An OHSO staff member authorized to act as the liaison between the Highway Safety Office and the State Agency or Local Subdivision in all matters pertaining to a contract

<u>Projection</u> - An anticipated level of performance or expenditure necessary to attain the stated project goal(s).

REGULATIONS AND DIRECTIVES

The subrecipient, its assignee(s), successor(s) in interest, subcontractor(s), supplier(s), or anyone who is a recipient of financial assistance through this grant shall agree to all applicable provisions of the following; however, nothing here should be interpreted to limit the requirements to comply with regulations and directives not included in this list:

1. Project Implementation

Grantee agrees to implement the project in accordance with federal statues, local statutes and regulations, as well as the policies and procedures established by the Oklahoma Fighway Safety Office.

2. Nondiscrimination

(applies to subrecipients as well as States)

The State highway safety agency will comply with all Federal statutes and implementing regulations relating to nondiscrimination ("Federal Nondiscrimination Authorities"). These include but are not limited to:

- Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq., 78 stat. 252), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin) and 49 CFR part 21;
- The Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, (42 U.S.C. 4601), (prohibits unfair treatment of persons displaced or whose property has been acquired because of Federal or Federal-aid programs and projects);
- Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973, (23 U.S.C. 324 et seq.), and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681-1683 and 1685-1686) (prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex);
- Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, (29 U.S.C. 794 et seq.), as amended, (prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability) and 49 CFR pa1i 27;
- The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, (42 U.S.C. 6101 et seq.), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of age);
- The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, (Pub. L. 100-209), (broadens scope, coverage and applicability of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, The Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, by expanding the definition of the terms "programs or activities" to include all of the programs or activities of the Federal aid recipients, subrecipients and contractors, whether such programs or activities are Federally-funded or not);
- Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. 12131-12189) (prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in the operation of public entities, public and private transportation systems, places of public accommodation, and certain testing) and 49 CFR parts 37 and 38;
- Executive Order 12898, Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations (prevents discrimination against minority populations by discouraging programs, policies, and activities with disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects on minority and low-income populations):
- Executive Order 13166, Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency (guards against Title VI national origin discrimination/discrimination/because of limited English proficiency (LEP) by ensuring that funding recipients take reasonable steps to ensure that LEP persons have meaningful access to programs (70 FR 74087-74100).

3. Political Activity (Hatch Act) (applies to subrecipients as well as States)

The state will comply with provisions of the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501-1508), which limits the political activities of employees whose principal employment activities are funded in whole or in part with Federal funds.

4. Buy America Act

(applies to subrecipients as well as States)

The state and each subrecipient will comply with the Buy America requirement (23 U.S.C. 313) when purchasing items using Federal funds.
